#### **STEM TERM 1 2024 MARCH**

Hello everyone,

All our Year levels are making good progress in STEM for Term 1. This month we are focusing on coding, keyboard skills, insects, and pollution. All our students are very enthusiastic and have been excited to get into a more focused approach to science and technology.

Our Foundation students have been working hard on the fine motor skills and eye coordination required to operate a keyboard and have adapted to a range of technology challenges. Some of our preps have also been learning about the basics of the coding program Scratch and have utilised the iPads to create characters and backgrounds.

Year 1/2's have been investigating minibeasts. They have also been learning about the unique physical structures and behaviour of one of the largest groups of organisms on the planet: insects.

Year 3/4's have been working on pollution and this month they will inquire into the ways the natural environment has been affected.

Year 5/6's have also been learning about pollution, but with a greater focus on one of the biggest pollution problems in the world at the moment: plastic.

Some of our senior students have also been learning bike mechanic skills from Jim and volunteers from the wonderful Men's Shed organisation and these groups will continue to learn useful hands-on skills for the rest of Term 1.

Twenty students from Years 2-6 have taken up the opportunity to play the recorder at Rye Primary School. Recorder Club meets Thursdays at lunchtime.




