This week they will finish the assessment period with Numeracy. I am very proud of the positive attitude all students have approached the tests with. Testing and assessment is a very normal part of our teaching and learning cycle to check student understanding and ensure we are stretching and supporting all students. NAPLAN assessments will provide our school and staff an additional data set to analyse and guide future actions.

STEM TERM 1 2024 - MARCH

Hello everyone,

All Year levels are nearing the end of their unit in STEM for Term 1. We are continuing to focus on coding and computer skills, insects, and pollution; with the inclusion of bees and digital diagrams using the iPad. Students have been excited to get into the amazing world of bees and have been using touchscreen technology to create insects.

Our Foundation students have been working on using the arrow keys and space bar to navigate objects in a game setting. Some of our preps have also been learning about the basics of the program Scratch and have utilised the iPads to create basic pictures of minibeasts.

Year 1/2's have been inquiring into the amazing world of bees. They have also been learning about the unique physical structures and behaviour of these incredibly important creatures.

Year 3/4's have been working on pollution and they are inquiring into the ways the natural environment has been negatively impacted by fossil fuels.

The 5/6's have been looking into pollution, but with a greater focus on the problem of micro plastics. Our Year 6's are also continuing work on bike mechanics with wonderful support from Jim and the Men's Shed.

Well done to all students for great progress in STEM for Term 1.




